ABOUT AU IN COSTA RICA

The Intensive Spanish Study in Costa Rica is a program designed to provide students with an immersion experience. Students attend four hours of language instruction per day at *Conversa Language Center* in Santa Ana. For additional cultural experiences, students live with host families and have the option of participating in excursions. All excursions are optional and cost between \$1 and \$125. Education majors may participate in a two-week field experience following their intensive language program.

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST (costs subject to change)

4 weeks (6 credits) - \$3000 6 weeks (8-9 credits) - \$4410 8 weeks (12 credits) - \$5820

INCLUDED: Ashland University tuition, single room with a host family, 3 meals a day while in Santa Ana, international health insurance, and transportation from San Jose Airport to Santa Ana and return transportation.

NOT INCLUDED: Flight (approx. \$850), passport (\$135), exit tax (\$29), pre-departure orientation textbook (\$10), spending money and excursions.

COURSES AVAILABLE

SPAN 200 Intensive Intermediate Spanish Study SPAN 300 Intensive Advanced Spanish Study SPAN 381 PK-8 Education in Costa Rica-2 credits

PREREQUISITE: Successful completion of SPAN 171 & 172 or equivalent (WebCAPE placement).

Students in SPAN 200 or SPAN 300 receive three credit hours for each two weeks of Spanish study. Prior to departure, students participate in orientation sessions at Ashland University. At *Conversa Language Center*, students are placed in a class commensurate with her/his abilities, based on the results of a written and oral assessment. Each Friday, students are evaluated by the instructor. Upon returning to Ashland University, students participate in a debriefing session with the faculty director.

EDUCATION MAJORS: Students participate in the traditional four week program. During weeks 5 and 6, students have a two-credit field placement in a Santa Ana school and an afternoon language class. The program is 6 weeks total and 8 credit hours.
