ABOUT HONORS 390: BRITISH ISLES

During Spring 2023, Honors students will take HON 390 studying cross-disciplinary topics about the history, culture, and economics of the locations to be visited. Specific topics have not been determined as it depends on the availability of faculty to teach the topics.

Following Commencement, Honors students will travel for 9 days in England, Ireland, and Wales in a group comprised solely of Honors students. Students will complete journals and CCI narratives based on their experiences on the trip.

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST

\$3,890 with 20 students

INCLUDED: Roundtrip airfare, in-country transportation, hotel accommodations, admission fees listed as included on the EF Travel & Tours itinerary, international health insurance, daily breakfast, select local dinners, 24/7 tour manager, drivers and local guides.

NOT INCLUDED: Trip cancellation and interruption insurance, meals not specified (approx. \$300), expenses for passport (\$165), ETIAS travel visa (\$7-\$9), optional excursions, independent sightseeing, and personal expenses.

TENTATIVE ITINERARY

DAY	LOCATION	PROGRAM
1	Travel	Depart the USA, arrive in Ireland.
2	Killarney, Ireland	Experience Medieval Irish life at Bunratty Castle.
3	Killarney, Ireland	Jump into history at the Kerry Bog Village Museum and explore a recreated 1800s Irish village. Take in views of the Atlantic Ocean and mountains of Macgillycuddy's Reeks from the Ring of Kerry, a 112-mile coastal route.
4	Blarney + Dublin, Ireland	Pass through Blarney on the way to Dublin. See the Rock of Cashel, Blarney Castle, and eat a traditional Guinness stew dinner in Dublin.
5	Dublin, Ireland	During a guided tour, visit the 5 Georgian Squares including St. Stephen's Green, O'Connell Street, Phoenix Park, and the presidential residence. Look at the Book of Kells at Trinity College and visit St. Patrick's Cathedral. Spend the second half of the day independently exploring Dublin.
6	British Midlands, England	Take a ferry to Holyhead, Wales, then travel through Snowdonia National park to the British Midlands. Visit a Welsh castle then have dinner in the British Midlands.
7	Stratford- upon-Avon + Oxford, England	Tour and eat lunch in Stratford-upon-Avon. Visit the house where Shakespeare was born and Anne Hathaway's childhood cottage. Tour Oxford.
8	London, England	Enjoy a guided tour of London, where you will visit Big Ben, Houses of Parliament, Piccadilly Circus, St. Paul's Cathedral, and possibly see the Changing of the Guard at Buckingham Palace. Have a fish and chips dinner.
