ABOUT IRELAND: HERITAGE TOUR

Dr. Swanson, Professor of Mathematics and the Director of the Honors Program, will lead a group of AU Honors students to Ireland in May 2017. The multi-city tour will provide students with the opportunity to experience firsthand the culture of Ireland. The tour is tied to the Spring 2017 Honors 390: Honors Interdisciplinary Seminar course, during which students will study various topics related to Ireland, including one segment dedicated to issues in modern day Ireland. Other topics in consideration for the course are Irish writers, film-makers, and poets, Irish music and dancing, the science of Robert Boyle, and Celtic art. The course has been approved to fulfill the CCI requirement Course with Study Away.

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST

Program Cost: \$3,139 (Increased airline fuel charges could raise the price)

INCLUDED: Airfare, hotel accommodations, ground transportation in Ireland, 7 breakfasts, 3 dinners, tickets for events in itinerary, tips, and international health insurance.

NOT INCLUDED: Transport to and from Ohio airport, other meals not specified, trip interruption and cancellation insurance, and personal expenses.

DATE	LOCATION	PROGRAM
Day 1	Fly to Ireland	Meet your group and travel on an overnight flight to Dublin.
Day 2-3	Dublin	Arrive in Dublin, orientation, visit Grafton Street, Temple Bar, Trinity College and St. Patrick's Cathedral. Sightseeing tour of Dublin.
Day 4	Dublin—Cork	Travel to Cork, a cultural center full of art, live music and a growing restaurant scene.
Day 5	Kinsale	Visit Blarney Castle. Group dinner in Kilarney.
Day 6	Killarney	A guided tour of the Ring of Kerry. Visit Bog Village a re-enactment of an early 1800s village.
Day 7-8	Dublin	Visit the Rock of Cashel, learn the history behind Dublin's Rebellion and the Irish Republic. Enjoy some free time in Dublin to explore.
Day 9	Depart for home	Transfer to the airport and check in for your return flight home.
