Embark on a two-week residency abroad, exploring the beautiful city of Paris through the eyes of a writer. Paris holds one of the greatest collections of cultural resources in the world, and its monuments, museums, parks, cafes, and shops will be your classroom. Students will participate in intensive workshops, discussions, readings, and in the literary and cultural life of the city as we begin to understand why Gertrude Stein said, "America is my country, and Paris is my hometown."

The residency will include workshops with faculty mentors, craft seminars and evening readings with writers living in Paris, plus cultural tours and events. The program is open to AU MFA students and alumni, as well as other writers who meet the pre-requisite requirements. Program participants not currently enrolled in the Ashland University MFA Program must apply and be accepted to the program as a non-degree seeking student.


