June 14 – June 26, 2020

Embark on a two-week residency while exploring the beautiful city of Paris through the eyes of a writer. Paris holds one of the greatest collections of cultural resources in the world, and its monuments, museums, parks, cafes, and shops will be your classroom. Students will participate in intensive workshops, discussions, readings, and in the literary and cultural life of the city as we begin to understand why Gertrude Stein said, "America is my country, and Paris is my hometown."

The residency will include workshops with faculty mentors, craft seminars, and evening readings with writers living in Paris, plus cultural tours and events. The program is open to AU MFA students and alumni.

Kirstin Chen's second novel, <u>Bury What We Cannot Take</u> (Little A, March 2018), was named a best book of the year by Entropy, Popsugar, and Book Bub, and a top pick of the season by Electric Literature, The Millions, The Rumpus, Harper's Bazaar, and InStyle. She is also the author of <u>Soy</u> <u>Sauce for Beginners</u>, an Amazon bestseller, an O, The Oprah Magazine "book to pick up now," and a Glamour book club pick. She has received awards from the Steinbeck Fellows Program, Sewanee, Hedgebrook, the Napa Valley Writers' Conference, the Toji Cultural Foundation, and the National Arts Council of Singapore. Her writing has appeared in Real Simple, Literary Hub, Writer's Digest, Manrepeller, Zyzzyva, and the Best New Singaporean Short Stories.

Kirstin Chen has lived in Paris and is fluent in French.
